American Rescue Plan Act (ARP) STUDENT PORTION QUARTERLY REPORT January 1 to March 31, 2022

In compliance with the requirements of the Federal Department of Education of the public reporting requirements for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under the **American Rescue Plan Act**, 2021 **(ARP)** section (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs, the University of Puerto Rico at Arecibo present this report:

The UPR at Arecibo as institution of higher education that already had an award under the student and institutional portion of the Cares Act, would not need to submit additional applications to access these funds. Rather, they would automatically process the additional funds of CRRSAA and ARPA as supplements to existing grants number P425E200779.

- 1. The University of Puerto Rico at Arecibo received their ARP grant funding through a supplemental award.
- 2. The allocation of funds under the American Rescue Plan Act, 2021 (ARP) is \$19,538,227, of which \$9,769,114 must be assigned as the minimum amount to be awarded in emergency aid to eligible students.
- 3. During January 1 to March 31, 2022 a total of \$4,178,233.55 was disbursed from ARP distributed equally in grants to students for terms. An ARP amount of \$114,800 was distributed to 83 students enrolled during the fall semester and \$4,063,433.55 distributed to 2,790 students during spring semester of the 2021-2022 academic year.
- 4. As of March 31, 2022, the University of Puerto Rico in Arecibo has already distributed of ARP a cumulative total of **\$9,652,633.55** and there is a balance of **\$116,480.45**.
- 5. The University of Puerto Rico in Arecibo has estimated that under **ARP**, UPRA will award an equal amount of funds to eligible students enrolled in the spring semester of the 2021-2022 academic year for which such funds may be applicable.
